 - d. 6 new teachers were hired this year. The 4th kindergarten still needs a full time Teacher.
- III. Review of school data and data teams in preparation for next Community Meetings
- a. STRIVE HI Data (3.0) for the school year 2016-17: Our scores have declined in both English Language Arts (ELA) 54% and Math 41%; Science has stayed high at 71%. Median Growth Percentile (MGP) should be about 50 or higher, ELA is 49%, Math is 41%.
 - b. Attendance: 25% of students missed 15 days or more. Climbed higher from 20% in 2016. Building incentives to get students to school. September is Attendance Awareness Month.
 - c. Student Safety: "Do students feel safe at this school?" 73% positive, 19% neutral, 8% negative.
 - d. About our school: Based on the enrollment of 482 in 2016-2017, 5% of students are English Language Learners, 51% of students are eligible for Free or Reduced Lunch, 8% of students receive Special Education services, 29% of students receiving Special Education are in general education classes most of the day. (This year our Special Education model is full inclusion with limited pull out instruction.)
 - e. New leadership team with Non Classroom Teachers (NCTs) Jenna Wash, SEL teacher, Jen Smith, Title I Coordinator, Zori Kornienko, Curriculum Coordinator, Barbara Potts, Technology Coordinator.
